Adjectives ending in '-ed' and '-ing'

الصفات المنتهية بـ (ed) و (ing)

I was really **bored** in that presentation . كنت أشعر بالملل في تلك المحاضرة .

That was a really **boring** presentation. لقد كانت محاضرة مملة جداً

Adjectives that end in -ed generally describe emotions (they tell us how people feel)

Examples:

I was so **bored** in that lesson; I almost fell asleep.

He was **surprised** to see his friend after all those years.

She was really **tired** and went to bed early.

Adjectives that end in -ing generally describe the thing that causes the emotion (a boring lesson makes you feel bored)

Examples:

Have you seen that film? It's really **frightening**.

I could listen to her for hours. She's so **interesting**.

I can't sleep! That noise is really **annoying**!
