

Floods are one of the most common natural disasters, second only to wildfires in rainforests. They occur almost everywhere in the world, causing damage and even death. Scientists have worked hard to predict floods, but the best **they** can do is recognise the conditions that might cause flooding. Several factors, such as deep snow and human mistakes, can lead to floods.



When deep snow melts, it turns into a large amount of water. Deep snow by itself does not usually cause floods, but when combined with heavy rain and warmer weather, it can. If the snow melts quickly on frozen or very wet ground, it is more likely to cause flooding. Frozen ground or ground that is already full of water cannot **soak up** the extra water from melting snow. The melting snow also increases the water level in rivers and streams. When rivers are already full, heavy rain can make them overflow and flood the surrounding land.

Rivers that are covered in ice can also lead to floods. When the ice melts, it cracks into big pieces. These pieces float down the river and can form a dam. The water behind the dam rises and floods the land upstream. If the dam breaks suddenly, the water behind it can flood the areas downstream as well.

When dam water is released, it can travel long distances, covering the ground with mud and waste. It can destroy everything in its path. Although scientists cannot always predict exactly when floods will happen, they know the conditions that make flooding likely. Conditions like deep snow, ice-covered rivers, and weak dams all make floods more likely.

Understanding why floods happen helps scientists predict them more accurately. Although predicting floods is still a challenge, knowing the conditions that cause floods can help us reduce the damage they cause. Hopefully, this knowledge of why floods happen can help us reduce the damage they cause.

It is worthwhile to try and discover the meaning of your dreams, as this can help you understand your feelings. One way to do this is by association. If you dream about people, ask: what does this person mean to me? If you dream about birds, for exmaple, think: do you love **them** or do they make you nervous? Some people claim they never dream; well, they do, but they just forget.

When the Great War of 1914-1918 broke out, Fleming became an army doctor and carried on his work in France. When a soldier was wounded in battle, a piece of his dirty clothing was often carried deep into the wound by the bullet. The wound would become bad or **septic**, causing disease to spread through the body. Sometimes, an arm or a leg has to be cut off, or the soldier would die, not from the wound itself, but from the infection poisoning in his body. This happened to thousands of soldiers during the Great War.

Fleming knew that microbes, which increased very quickly, caused a disease of this kind. It was believed that washing the wound with an acid called antiseptic might kill them. However, despite immediate antiseptic treatment, soldiers continued to die in large numbers. After the war, Fleming went on working for years, trying to find an antiseptic which would stop microbes from growing but would not harm the blood cells so that the body could carry on its own fight against the disease naturally.

One day he stopped to examine the glass dishes on which he had grown some microbes in a special liquid. In one dish, he was surprised to notice a greenish mould. That meant a tiny seed, too small to see, must have floated on the dish when the lid was off. Fleming took a closer look and then made a careful examination. And believe it or not, a strange thing happened: in the area where the greenish mould was growing, the disease microbes disappeared! Fleming began to grow enough of the mould to make from <u>it</u> a clear liquid, which tests showed could kill microbes or stop them in both animals and humans without harming their white blood cells. He called the liquid penicillin.

To this day, pigeon post remains useful in the most remote areas where electricity and Internet are unavailable. Nowadays, there are a lot of procedures for sending a letter or a package to any part of the world. Among the popular options is the postal service like FedEx. Shipping fees vary depending on the size, weight, the contents of your letter or package and its destination. You must also consider when you want the package to arrive: overnight shipping (delivered by the next day) or next-flight-out shipping (where your package is shipped as soon as a flight is available). If not urgent, there is also shipping that takes one to five days.

If you need to send a letter faster, the Internet is always available and offers various options. Email is one of the most common methods. Through an email service, you do not have to write down on paper, use a stamp or spend money. Emailing is a method of sending a letter virtually and the recipient can immediately receive <u>it</u> in a matter of seconds or minutes.

People think children should play sports. Sports are fun, and children stay healthy while playing with others. However, playing sports can have negative effects on children. It may produce feelings of poor self-confidence or <u>aggressive</u> behaviour in some children.

According to research on children and sports, 40 million children play sports in the US. Of these, 18 million say they have been yelled at or called names while playing sports. This leaves many children with a bad impression of sports. They think sports are just too aggressive. Many researchers believe adults, especially parents and coaches, are the main cause of too much aggression in children's sports. <u>They</u> believe children copy aggressive adult behaviour. This behaviour is then further reinforced through both positive and negative feedback.

Parents and coaches are powerful teachers because children usually look up to them. Often these adults behave aggressively themselves, sending children the message that winning is everything. At children's sporting events, parents may yell insults at other players or cheer when their child behaves aggressively. As well, children may be taught that hurting other players is acceptable, or they may be pushed to continue playing even when they are injured.

In addition, the media makes violence seem exciting. Children watch adult sports games and see violent behaviour replayed over and over on television. As a society, we really need to face up to this problem and do something about it . Parents and coaches should act as better examples for children. They also need to teach children better values. They should teach children to enjoy themselves whether they win or not. It is not necessary to knock yourself out to enjoy sports. Winning is not everything. In addition, children should not be allowed to continue to play when they are injured. Sending a child with an injury into a game gives the child the message that health is not as important as winning. If we make some basic changes, children might learn to enjoy sports again.
